**CITY OF BRISTOL
EMERGENCY MEETING**

12:15 P.M.

Vice-chairman Tom Clemons called this Emergency Meeting to Order at 12:15 p.m. with Council-member Brigham Shuler present, and Council-member John Ritter present by phone. Mayor Steven Cutshaw, Attorney D. Jackson Summers, and City Clerk Robin Hatcher were also present. Chairman Durwood Stewart and Council-member Ellen Lewis were not in attendance.

Mayor Cutshaw offered an Opening Prayer.

Attorney Summers read, in its entirety Emergency Ordinance #2018-01, AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE IN THE AFTERMATH OF HURRICANE MICHAEL ADDRESSING IMMEDIATE NEEDS DUE TO THE IMPACT AND DESTRUCTION FROM THIS NATURAL DISASTER. This Ordinance imposes a temporary moratorium against burning inside the City limits in order to mitigate the risk of fire and other health hazards. It further imposes a temporary moratorium on clearing of debris on City rights-of-way by private individuals in order to prevent damage to city infrastructure. It further authorizes City personnel to undertake any action necessary to restore or maintain services, including, but not limited to, going onto private property. This Emergency Ordinance will remain in effect until further notice. Effective October 13, 2018. Motion by Shuler, second by Cutshaw to enact Emergency Ordinance #2018-01 effective immediately, carried unanimously and enacted immediately beginning at 12:30 p.m. on Saturday, October 13, 2018.

There being no further business, Councilman Shuler moved to adjourn, seconded by Councilman Ritter, all voted in favor. Meeting adjourned at 12:30 p.m.
